7. THE POLICY

The BMCC Board of Regents Employee Tuition Award Policy

The BMCC Board of Regents (BOR) Employee Tuition Award may be awarded to nonnative students admitted to BMCC who complete the required application and meet the following guidelines:

- 1. Must be a non-native spouse or eligible dependent of a **FULL TIME** employee. The College follows the IRS definition of a dependent and spouse when determining eligibility for this award, which provides the employee with a tax-free benefit.
- 2. Must maintain a 2.0 GRADE POINT AVERAGE.
- 3. Students must display **GOOD MORAL CHARACTER** to remain eligible (the *BMCC Student Handbook* defines acceptable student behavior).

Any student currently earning below a 2.0 cumulative Grade Point Average (GPA) at the end of the academic year will be placed on probation and have one academic year to bring their GPA up to a 2.0. If the student fails to achieve a 2.0 GPA during the probationary period, they will not be eligible until their cumulative GPA is brought up to the 2.0 requirement.

Students granted the BMCC BOR Employee Tuition Award will still be required to cover other costs, such as textbooks and fees.

High school dual enrollment students are not eligible for this award.
