7. THE POLICY

The BMCC Board Of Regents Tuition Award Policy-Tribal High School Dual **Enrollment Students**

The Board of Regents (BOR) Dual Enrollment Award WAIVES TUITION costs of summer semester for tribal high school students admitted to BMCC who complete the required application and meet the following guidelines:

- 1. Must be a TRIBAL MEMBER of a U.S. Federally Recognized Tribe and submit a copy of your tribal I.D. or verification of tribal membership from your Tribal Enrollment Clerk.
- Must maintain a 2.0 GRADE POINT AVERAGE.
- Students must display GOOD MORAL CHARACTER to remain eligible (the BMCC Student Handbook defines acceptable student behavior).
- 4. Any student not achieving a minimum 2.0 BMCC cumulative GPA in the dual enrollment program who enrolls at BMCC after graduation as a regular student will find that their dual enrolled GPA could have an adverse impact on their financial aid eligibility.

The BOR Dual Enrollment Tuition Award is limited to a maximum of two (2) classes per summer semester, but in no case more than eight (8) credits per summer semester.

Students granted the BOR Dual Enrollment Tuition Award will still be required to cover other costs, such as textbooks and fees.
