

**Bay Mills Community College & Northern Michigan University  
Anishinaabe Language Teaching Certification Partnership Program  
131 total credits to degree**

Individuals who do not hold a bachelor’s degree wishing to obtain a Michigan K-12 teaching certificate in Anishinaabemowin Language and Culture (FN) will utilize the following pathway for licensure:

1. Complete the Bay Mills Associate of Arts Anishinaabe Language Instruction completing a second science course to obtain the Michigan Transfer Agreement Seal – **83 credits total**
2. Apply to Northern Michigan University declaring “Native American Studies” as the major
3. Recommendation to the Michigan Department of Education requires completion of the bachelor’s degree in Native American Studies and the required Professional Education coursework:
  - Northern Michigan University Native American Studies (NAS) Major – Bay Mills CC credits plus **28 credits** at NMU for the NAS Major
  - Professional Education Secondary Education Coursework – Bay Mills CC credits plus **20 credits** at NMU in the School of Education Professional Education Sequence
  - **131 credits to degree** – combined Bay Mills Community College and Northern Michigan University

**ASSOCIATE OF ARTS - ANISHINAABE LANGUAGE INSTRUCTION**

The Anishinaabe Language Instruction program is designed to encourage and promote the understanding and preservation of the Anishinaabe language and prepare the student to function as a language instructor. It is also designed to enhance students’ cultural awareness and offer the opportunity to develop a functional command of the Anishinaabe language, which can be further expanded through additional study or through contact with other speakers of the language. Students will gain an understanding of the structure of the language, learn pedagogical principles and methods for teaching Anishinaabemwin
